"Welcome to 'Crafting Generations' - a unique journey where solidarity, volunteering, arts and crafts as well as sustainable development met to improve the community.

Funded by the European Solidarity Corps, this project has been a vibrant platform for young volunteers to explore the topics of sustainable development, craftsmanship and entrepreneurship. Our mission: to foster cultural awareness, stimulate creativity, and empower the local community through solidarity activities.

The project involved 2 individual volunteers: Andrei-Cristian Dunaev from Romania and Aleksandra Szpakowska from Poland.





Objectives

Overarching aim of the project was to implement solidarity activities through which volunteers will create an inclusive environment (facilities and programs) for children and elderly people in the local (rural) community of the city of Samobor.

The context of the project was set into the framework of educational projects for vulnerable groups that the hosting organization implements within Eco educational farm Greenville, where the solidarity efforts of the volunteers were directed into development of educational content as well as promoting intercultural diversity, sustainable development and craftsmanship among children, youth and elderly people.

A significant objective was also to develop personal and professional competencies necessary for the (self-)employment of young people. This included fostering skills like initiative, independence, self-confidence, and employability.





Activities

Workshops

The activity was focused on involving volunteers to create and implement educational content for children, young people with fewer opportunities as well as elderly people that strived to increase their environmental awareness, appreciation for traditions as well as to broaden their horizons in the aspect of European identity. Within a framework of this activity as well as with the support of the project team, the volunteers organized workshops for children in the Youth Center and at the Eco Farm Greenville.

Personal projects

The individual projects undertaken by the volunteers – "Green Defenders" and "Place fur Friends" – were aimed at enriching knowledge about the environment, promoting sustainable practices, and animal welfare. These projects not only contributed to the personal development of the volunteers but also to the broader community by raising awareness on important social and environmental issues.





The project significantly enhanced the skills and employability of the target groups, particularly young people and volunteers. Skills in crafts, environmental care, and social entrepreneurship were developed, directly contributing to better employment prospects and entrepreneurial capabilities. Participants gained improved awareness of cultural diversity and environmental issues. "Crafting Generations" fostered an appreciation for cultural heritage and crafts, while "Green Getters" emphasized the importance of ecological sustainability and conservation. By engaging young people, especially those with fewer opportunities, the project promoted social inclusion and active participation in societal development, addressing the challenge of social exclusion.

The project facilitated community engagement, creating a sense of cohesion and collective responsibility, particularly evident in activities like arts and crafts workshops, ecological programs for children and elderly people as well as in active citizenship workshops for highschool students. Local awareness and practices regarding environmental conservation and sustainable living were significantly enhanced, addressing local environmental challenges. The most important local impact is the ground for implementation of local projects for children, young people and elderly people at Greenville Eco Farm, which would be impossible without the efforts of the volunteers in creating the polygon for such education.



Learning outcomes





Competences

Participants gained in-depth knowledge about crafts, cultural diversity, and environmental sustainability. Skills developed included craft techniques (like sewing, woodworking, painting), project management, and social entrepreneurship. Participants cultivated a sense of initiative, creativity, and cultural sensitivity. These competences aligned well with the planned objectives, particularly in fostering creative expression and developing specific craft skills. In the projects developed and implemented by the volunteers in this activity (Green defenders and Place fur friends), participants increased understanding of environmental issues, waste management, and the importance of the 5 R's (Refuse, Reduce, Reuse, Recycle, Rot). They developed project planning and implementation skills, along with public awareness campaign skills. They also enhanced their environmental awareness, responsibility, and proactive engagement in sustainability. Furthermore, participants developed knowledge about animal care, farm maintenance, and rural lifestyle. They increased their practical skills in construction, material handling, and teamwork. It contributed to development of empathy, collaboration, and commitment to animal welfare and community development.
